Bringing Youth to Christ Through Scouting

February is Scouting month. The Scouting ministry at Orange UMC is more than just an activity for our youth to learn about the outdoors.

Scouting provides fun, fellowship, and training to our youth as well as youth in our community. It emphasizes honesty, self-reliance, and respect. Through a year-round program, it affects character, citizenship, and personal fitness. But the success of our Scouting depends on our volunteers, who serve in a variety of leadership roles so that our young people may benefit from our Scouting ministry.

As the Boy Scouts of America celebrates its 100th anniversary in 2010, we salute the splendid volunteers who serve as Cubmasters, Scoutmasters, and Venturing Advisors, and in other positions of leadership. Many volunteers give their time so Scouting's members will be involved in a quality program. Merit badge counselors help Scouts learn more about vocations and hobbies. Volunteers see that the Scout camps of the Atlanta Area Council have the necessary physical facilities and that all camp activities meet the high health and safety standards of the national organization. Volunteers serve behind the scenes on committees so that community organizations using the Scouting program can find the best leadership possible for the youth related to their organizations. Volunteers also provide training for these leaders and offer a continuing service to every Cub Scout pack, Boy Scout troop, and Venturing crew.

As you can see many men and women offer their services to Scouting, but more volunteers are always needed to serve as leaders or share their special skills with young people and other adults. All these people experience a special sense of achievement through their work in Scouting.

While there are only two Girl Scout troops (Troops 7016 & 2743) that meet at our Church, they have a huge impact in the surrounding area. There are 25 troops in the area with about 270 girls. The schools in the local area are Free Home, Macedonia, Avery, Ball Ground, Creekland and Creekview.

We congratulate all the volunteers who are active in Scouting throughout Orange Community and want to offer a special prayer and word of thanks to the leaders of Pack 469, Troop 469, chartered to Orange UMC and Girl Scout Troops 7016 and 2743 that use Orange UMC as their meeting place. On Sunday, February 14, we will have Scout Sunday to pray for all who are a part of this great ministry.

Again, this year we will provide a monthly update which is shown below on giving and the monthly financial status.

Last year through the special projects like the yard sale, fellowship dinners, silent auction, fish fry, golf tournament, 13th-month Campaign, etc., approximately \$13,000 was added to our general fund. Thank you for your support of each of those projects. We will continue to host at least some, if not

all, of these special activities again. We will formulate a tentative schedule and begin planning for each in the next couple of months. We will announce dates and plans as they are finalized. Please plan to participate and support these special projects again this year. If you have ideas for other special projects, please share those with Pastor Max, Paula Smith or any of the members of the Finance Committee.

We share in our dedication to God’s service and our sincere desire to continue God’s work in our community. Although this year certainly may continue to be challenging economically, we have the assurance and comfort of knowing that God is with us providing strength and help. Please be in prayer and give as you can throughout the year. Again, thank you for your service, dedication and support.

“The List”

One of my favorite gifts this past Christmas was a CD by Rosanne Cash entitled, *The List*. Rosanne is the daughter of the late Johnny Cash. The summer she graduated from high school, Rosanne spent touring with her father. On the bus, traveling from town to town, the two would talk about music and musicians. It was the early 1970s and to her surprise, Rosanne found that there were many artists that she and her father both liked. However, Johnny was concerned because he would often ask his daughter about songs that she knew nothing about. Many of the songs were folk songs and old ballads. One day, Johnny Cash took a legal pad and wrote out a list of 100 songs he thought anyone should know, who really wanted to understand American music. He gave the list to Rosanne and said, “If you really want to appreciate the music of Bob Dylan, Bruce Springsteen and some of the popular folk groups today, you need to appreciate the music which shaped them.” Rosanne kept the list all these years. Her new

CD features songs off that list given to her by her father almost 40 years ago. There are some great duets she performs with some of the musicians that she and her father admired across the years.

A few weeks ago, I began a sermon series on the Lord’s Prayer. This prayer is one of the items I would put on a very short list of things that every Christian must learn to appreciate and cherish across the years, if you want to grow and stay rooted in your faith (the other two items I would put on that list are the Apostles’ Creed and the Sermon on the Mount). The season of Lent will begin on February 17. Historically Lent is a time to practice self-denial and grow in your faith. Perhaps this year, you will use this time to grow in your understanding, practice of and living of the Lord’s Prayer.

Orange UMW Responds to Baby Blanket Request

The national United Methodist Women Organization has requested that Methodist women make baby blankets and shawls to be distributed to the five Methodist jurisdictions in the United States. These will be given to women and infants in medical and crisis centers. Orange United Methodist Women are responding with plans to make baby blankets at our next meeting on Monday, January 25. It has been requested that all blankets and shawls be completed in time for the UMW's National Assembly which will be held in St. Louis, Missouri in April. During church service on February 28, we will have a special consecration ceremony for all blankets and shawls before they are shipped.

With a March 1 deadline, we have only a short time to complete this Mission Project. If anyone would like to make a blanket or a shawl at home, the shawls can be either knitted or crocheted and the blankets can be simple no-sew fleece with tied-off fringe, or of pre-printed quilted fabric with machine-sewn binding. Blanket sizes: 30" x 30", 32" x 32", 36" x 36", or 38" x 38". If you would like to be reimbursed for purchased materials, save your receipts and OUMW will reimburse you.
